HEARTY WINTER RECIPE: COWBOY STEW

Stay warm during the holidays and beyond with this simple and hearty, one-pot cowboy stew!

Ingredients

- Bacon (4 slices chopped)
- Kielbasa Sausage (24 oz cut into ½ inch slices)
- Ground Beef (1 ½ pounds)
- Onion (1 medium)
- Garlic (3 cloves)
- Flour (3 tbsp)
- Salt (1 ½ tsp)
- Pepper (½ tsp)
- Chili Powder (1 tsp)
- Diced Tomatoes (14.5 oz can with liquid)
- Baked Beans (16 oz)
- Green Chilies (7 oz can)
- Sweet Corn (15 oz can)
- Russet Potatoes (2 medium)
- Parsley (2 tbsp)

Instructions

- 1) Cook bacon until brown and crispy in a large pot. Set aside.
- 2) Add the sausage to the pot drippings and brown on both sides. Set aside.
- 3) Add beef, onion, and garlic to the pot.
- 4) Brown until the beef is no longer pink.
- 5) Sprinkle flour, salt, pepper, and chili powder into the mixture. Stir and cook for 1 minute.
- 6) Add diced tomatoes, beans, green chilies, sweet corn, potatoes, bacon, sausage, and 1 cup of water
- 7) Bring to a boil, immediately reduce heat and simmer covered for 1 hour. Stir occasionally.
- 8) Enjoy!
